

A COMMENT ON CONSERVATION EASEMENTS: "I'm fully supportive of the Berg's [a family who placed their land under a conservation easement] doing what they wish with their private property. That is their right as a property owner. I do not believe, however, that others should be forced to subsidize their decision.

"Let's say that I make a different decision for my property; that I'm not presumptuous enough to believe I know today what is best for my family/heirs 50 or 100 years from now, and trust they will manage the property in a manner that is most beneficial to them, and I chose to not limit or restrict their options. In that case, the government punishes me with income, estate and other taxes. If I had made the same decisions as the Bergs, my decision would be subsidized, or free from the aforementioned taxes.

"I don't believe the government should subsidize one person's decision and punish another person's opposite decision on the future of their property. Leave us free to make our own property decisions without government interference." Source: Frank Dubois, *The Westerner*, 3/4/17.

FOREST PROFILES: CONSULTING FORESTERS by Jessica Nelson



Graham Forestry and Appraisals is a

full service consultancy in Butler serving landowners in Alabama and Mississippi. Owner John Graham says he grew up listening to stories about logging from his father and grandfather, and forestry was a natural fit for him. His son works with him now as a field technician, making the fourth generation of their family in the forest industry. Although timber management was his focus when Graham established his consultancy in 1989, appraisals now make up about fifty percent of his day-today work. He prides himself on keeping up with technology, especially mapping and GIS. Those have made a big difference in the information he can provide clients and in the range he can cover. The next wave of technology is drones, he says. Like many other foresters, he has applied for the commercial license and is practicing with one of the machines. He says the need to stay in sight of the little craft limits the use to some degree, but also thinks they might be particularly helpful in helping fight the pine beetle crisis now facing many Alabama landowners in the wake of last year's drought. With all the tools at his disposal, Graham says his favorite part of the job is still walking through a tract for the first time and working out a management plan for a landowner.

Southern Parallel Forest Products in

Albertville is a sawmill producing dimension lumber from Southern Yellow Pine. They cut sizes from 2x4 to 2x10, as well as 1x4 and decking. After a production hiatus of about four years, the mill was purchased by Parallel 55, a family-owned company from Prince George, Canada. Production began under the new ownership at the end of 2013, says Andy Moore, Vice President of Operations. He says from an optimization and automation standpoint, the Albertville mill could be considered dated. However, the mill is not only running efficiently, but safety has improved ninety percent since March of last year. Moore emphasizes what he calls an old-fashioned approach to safety, developed over his forty-three years in the industry. It involves not just compliance, but creating a culture of teamwork, so employees look out for each other and feel comfortable enough to speak up if they see something unsafe. Culture is much harder to change than just meeting regulatory requirements, he says, but the result is a safer workplace with no loss of efficiency. Southern Parallel Forest Products purchases wood from wood dealers rather than landowners directly, and has an annual capacity of 92 million board feet per year. Southern Parallel lumber is sold primarily to treaters, retailers, and truss manufacturers, and ships throughout North America.

A BAMBOO VARIETY that will grow 2 feet per day and reach a height of 80 feet with diameters of 6 to 8 inches may become the basis of a new business in Greene County, Alabama. According to an article in Farm Show, vol. 41, no. 2, Resource Fiber has a 4,000 acre farm where initial bamboo groves will be planted in 2018. Markets are still being developed, but the company hopes to supply raw material for railroad ties, truck trailer decking and other industrial products. Headquarters for the new business is in Homewood, Alabama. When we "poorest people," the words "greenhouse gas," and "visionaries" on the promotional webpage, our "be wary" antenna went up. We would welcome reports on this operation from AFOA members in the area.

A MORE LIGHT-HEARTED USE OF A FEW BUZZ-WORDS: "In Mobile, my longleaf is all naturally regenerated, I haven't planted anything. So I'm going to advertise them as 'free range, non-GMO, organically grown pine trees." Source: Forest Landowner and Consulting Forester Keville Larson as quoted in Alabama Forests, Winter, 2017. Further into the article featuring Larson's life and successes, he worries that "a whole lot more wood is being grown than is being used....if it continues it could put pressure on private landowners to the point they might need to find other ways to get some return, like recreation or growing other crops." So maybe looking into the possibilities of growing bamboo isn't so far fetched.


