# What are the fees on my tax bill?

The Revenue Commission collects the fees set by each entity. Any concerns or questions should be directed to the corresponding jurisdictions below.

### Fire Fee

Act 1990-697 created fire districts for fighting fires in Mobile County outside the municipal boundaries. The proceeds of the fire fee take care of the expense of establishing and maintaining these fire districts. Please contact your area Volunteer Fire District if you have any questions.

#### Storm Fee

Ordinance 01-024 authorizes the City of Mobile to collect an annual storm water fee to promote efficient compliance with federal and state laws, rules, regulations, and permits relating to discharges into and from municipal storm sewers. Any person aggrieved by this storm fee assessment may file a written appeal with the city clerk within 60 days from the notice of the fee. ## Weed Fee

Article IV of Chapter 52 of the Mobile Municipal Code deals with property nuisances and lot maintenance. The costs incurred by the city to remove any nuisance such as growth of weeds, scrub and grass exceeding community standards, will be charged, and become a lien on your property. #### Demo Fee

Article II of Chapter 52 of the Mobile Municipal Code deals with removing or demolishing building and structures that have been deemed a public nuisance. The costs incurred by the City are charged and becomes a lien on the property. For any questions contact Municipal Enforcement at 251-208-6290.

Revenue Commission Offices will be closed Friday, December 31, 2021 for the New Year's holiday. Taxpayers will not be charged late penalties and interest if paid by Monday, January 3, 2022.
