# **Piedmont Plateau Birding Trail**

Thirty-four Birding Sites in Nine Counties in East Central Alabama!

The Piedmont Plateau Birding Trail, which launched November 2011, consists of the counties of: *Autauga, Chambers, Chilton, Clay, Coosa, Elmore, Lee, Randolph, and Tallapoosa*. This nine-county group is one of eight regions that comprise the recently completed Alabama Birding Trails, offering 270 sites across the state to go birding, whether you are a seasoned 'birder' or a novice, from the mountains of North Alabama to the beaches of the Gulf Coast. Thirty-four of these sites are in the Piedmont Plateau Birding Trail. The original 2011 team has been meeting to plan and present a series of events during 2014 to coincide with similar events throughout the state. The purpose of this newsletter is to let you know the plans for this state-wide program and what part the Piedmont Plateau Region plays. We will be making contact with site managers, our elected officials, stakeholders and media outlets as we schedule these events.
