It's Chestnut Tree Planting Time -- And we need your help!

The new Chestnut Ridge Seed Orchard will be planted on December 29 and 30. This is a great site for growing chestnuts in Moore County, Tennessee, and an Historic Opportunity to participate in the establishment of the largest regional seed orchard project in the Southeast. We have more than 1000 trees to plant from multiple lines of resistance. Families include half-sibs and full-sibs of second-, third-, and fourth-backcross F2 hybrids. The hybrids descend from North Carolina, Alabama, and Tennessee naturally occurring American chestnut germplasm. We will need lots of help on Tuesday and Wednesday, 29 and 30 December 2020 to get these one-year-old container-grown chestnut trees into the ground. So, if you own a shovel, it could be put to good use here. Sensible shoes and work gloves are a must! Dress for the weather and don't forget your mask.
