Legislative Alert

AFA is supporting legislation to limit government's authority to exercise eminent domain rights to condemn private property. Current law provides that the state and a municipal or county governing body may exercise the power of eminent domain for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, or operating streets and roadways, government buildings, and park and recreation facilities. SB105, sponsored by Senator Tom Whatley, would provide that for eminent domain purposes, park and recreation facilities do not include trails for biking and hiking.

Opposing the bill are certain municipalities that obviously believe that bike trails are legitimate uses of the government's power to take property. We disagree.
